What to bring?

Due to COVID-19 and the on-going social distancing requirements your shore based sessions will take place OUTSIDE, please therefore bring warm clothing & wet weather gear / jacket and a thermos/hot drink.

Pre-Course Work:

Prepare a 5-10 minute shore based interactive session on <u>all</u> of the subjects below PRIOR to your course:

- Types of PWC and systems (i.e. RiDE, iBR)
- Personal PWC riding gear options & their importance
- Security, Theft prevention & trailer laws
- Capsize recovery procedure and considerations
- <u>Creating a route plan (basic pilotage plan) including methods & considerations</u>
- · Byelaws and Courtesy to other water users

Bring your session plans, notes & any teaching aids you have created along with you to your course as you will be delivering at least 1 of these sessions during the course.

The aim of each of the above is to assess both your knowledge and your ability to deliver an effective and interactive shore based session to a group of students.

These shore based sessions should follow the guidelines below:

Session must have an introduction, a middle and a summary

V Be technically accurate

Be interesting and relevant (to PWC riders)

The students must be able to hear you, see any visual aids and be as involved as possible

You must check for understanding from your students, during or at the end of your session.
